# 1. You'd better~: 너는 ~을 꼭 해야만 해

You'd better call it quits.

You'd better walk out on him.

You'd better start looking for Mr. Right.

You'd better stop making moves on her.

### 2. Don't tell me~: 설마 ~은 아니겠죠.

Don't tell me you're going crazy over her.

Don't tell me you have a thing for Serena.

### 3. There's someone else who~: ~ 한 사람이 또 있어

There's someone else who makes me way too wired.

There's someone else who drives me up the wall.

There's someone else who takes it out on me.

There's someone else who went over my head.

### 4. Do you happen to know: 혹시 ~ 을 알고 있니?

Do you happen to know why he is pissed off?

Do you happen to know why it gets under my skin?

Do you happen to know why I'm really bummed out?

### 9. I wish~: ~라면 정말 좋겠어.

I wish I hadn't gotten the boot!

I wish I were on a roll.

I wish she knew that the sky was the limit.

### 10. There's no way~: ~하는 건 불가능해

There is no way I'm picking up the slack.

There is no way I can pack this up.

There is no way he works his ass off.

There is no way he's up to his ears in work.

### 11. I'm supposed to + 동사원형: ~하기로 되어있다.

I'm supposed to make an excuse for all of us.

I'm supposed to take a rain check on dinner.

She's supposed to act like she's into him.

She's supposed to finish it soon.
